Bill Monahan called the regular meeting to order at 9:00 am.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS: None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Bill Monahan made a motion to approve the minutes from the May regular meeting. Lou Kovach seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Bill Monahan made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and to pay all bills. Lou Kovach seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Supervisors are continuing to review the Township's Floodplain Maps. Maps are available for the public to review at the Township Building by appointment.

CORRESPONDANCE:

Bill reported that the Township received a letter from the Bureau of Municipal Services regarding all Township roads that receive liquid fuel allocations. This letter stated that a portion of Township Road 359 (Beal Road) had been gated. If the gate remained, it would be removed from the liquid fuel allocations.

Bill reported that in a November 4, 2002 public Township meeting, Becky Vecchio (one of the property owners on Beal Road) requested permission to put a gate on a small portion of Beal Road which leads to a private road and a dead end. There is roughly a little over 2/10 of a mile of road that is gated. Permission was then given by supervisors Bill Kennedy, Ed Brumley, and Larry Lapana. Since this occurred in 2002, an agreement was made between the supervisors and the landowners that the landowners would maintain the gated portion of the road. It was assumed that this small portion of Beal Road would have been removed from the liquid fuel allocation by the supervisors 11 years ago at the time permission was granted.

NEW BUSINESS & PUBLIC COMMENT:

Larry Rogerson asked if the Township had a detailed audit report chart for 2010. Bill said the auditors were asked and they did not prepare one for 2010.

Trudi Monahan wanted to report that no Township monies have been put into Beal Road past the gate since it has been in place.

George Gaynor asked who is responsible for repairing the roads in Penn Pitt since the Water Authority has been putting in new lines. Bill responded that he attended the DVJMA meeting, and that he and Lou had spoken to Frank Bosley about DVJMA fixing all roads that had been affected by the water line replacement. DVJMA will be responsible for repairing the roads, not the contractor. George also asked if some pine tree limbs could be trimmed that are hanging over the road.

Patty Jordan asked that the gate not be removed from Beal Road. She and her husband own property there and are very concerned about it.

Bill Monahan reported that he and Lou have finished the cold patching, cut roadsides, serviced the tractors, and finished repairing the truck beds this month.

Trudi Monahan asked Cindy Bailey about an article that was published in the editorial section of the Greenespeak newspaper in May. A lengthy, heated discussion ensued with Cindy standing by the article that she insisted she had written. Bill told Cindy that she crossed the line when she mentioned his church in the article.

Bill reported that a rock flew up when mowing and shattered the side glass on one of the tractors.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Bill Monahan and seconded by Lou Kovach to adjourn the meeting at 9:30 am. The motion passed unanimously.
