Bill Monahan called the regular meeting to order at 9:00 am.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS: None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Lou Kovach made a motion to approve the minutes from the August regular meeting. Bill Monahan seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Bill Monahan made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and to pay all bills. Lou Kovach seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Supervisors are continuing to review the Township's Floodplain Maps. Maps are available for the public to review at the Township Building by appointment.

CORRESPONDANCE: None

NEW BUSINESS AND PUBLIC COMMENT:

Bill reported on work that has been done in the Township during the month of August. Bill and Lou cleaned ditchlines on Hillman Street and Lower Sandy Run, cut and weed-eated around stop signs and road signs, repaired drain box and cleaned drains in Penn Pitt, re-graded Creek Road, put down 2 loads

of cold patch in Seventh Pool and Poland Mines, pulled the recycle trailer 4 times, did food bank, removed trees and tree tops from roads, cut grass and weed-eated at Township Building several times, had emergency time on washouts on Robena, Creek, and Maple Ridge Roads.

Bill thanked Keith Drew for his help in removing debris from drains with a pump truck. 9,000 gallons of water was needed to flush and clean the drains.

Bill said the plans for this week include work on Kovach Road to address a water run-off issue. The plan is to re-cut the ditchline. Grass cutting, storm cleanup, drainwork, and tree-trimming in Penn Pitt will continue and work on Sugar Grove Road will begin this month.

Bill reported that the supervisors met with the Greene County Department of Economic Development and attended the Greene County Commissioners' hearing to request additional CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) monies and an extension on the \$235,000.00 2010 grant for the Alicia/Poland Mines sewage project.

Bill introduced Robbie Matesic, Executive Director of the Greene County Department of Economic Development. Robbie explained the CDBG funding process to the audience. She said that the Commissioners will announce tomorrow that Monongahela Township is the recipient of this year's CDBG funds (\$178,607.00) for water line replacement.

Trudi Monahan asked Robbie if the 2010 grant funds could also be used for the water project. Robbie explained that the Supervisors and the Commissioners would have to request that change from the State. Bill asked Robbie when that decision would have to be made, and Robbie said in six months.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Bill Monahan and seconded by Lou Kovach to adjourn the meeting at 9:20 am. The motion passed unanimously.

In an executive session after the meeting, 3 bids for an ash shed were discussed by the supervisors. Information is still being gathered before a decision is made.
